#### New Year's Eve Trail 2009



On December 31, Vienna's Old Town will be transformed into the venue of a giant party. Top quality entertainment awaits revelers along the New Year's Eve Trail, which winds its way through the narrow lanes of the old city from City Hall, flanked by about 80 different refreshment stands offering warming winter punch and a range of culinary delights. Performers on the various stages around the city contribute to the festive mood with musical entertainment from waltzes and operettas to rock and folk.



#### Winter at MQ

Things get hot on even the coldest of winter days in the MuseumsQuartier, thanks to the bar in the Ice Palace, an ice rink, an ice climbing wall as well as a varied program of DJ sounds, readings and all sorts of activities.





Those who prefer action to drinking punch can try their hand at the five-meter high **ice climbing wa**ll or dance over the ice on **skates**. The title of "MQ Curling King" or "MQ Curling Queen" is fought over at **curling**, with the prize being an annual ticket to the Leopold Museum and Mumok.

The pond of the MuseumsQuartier hosts the "Winter Race" - with remote-controlled cars. **DJs** provide warming sounds through the winter, while Austrian authors dispense warming thoughts at readings. A separate program is served up for "Cool Kids".

## Painting of the Biedermeier period



A festival for friends of the Biedermeier is offered by the Vienna Museum with its exhibition of masterpieces of Austrian art between 1815 and 1848. On view are paintings by important painters – such as Friedrich von Amerling, Ferdinand Georg Waldmüller, Peter Fendi, Josef Danshauser, Rudolf von Alt and Adalbert Stifter.

The **most popular subjects** of the Biedermeier period are in the show - from **portraits** to **everyday scenes** and masterly **still lifes** to light-drenched **landscapes**.

Be impressed by detailed nature studies as well as the humorous-anecdotal narrations and moralizing melodramas. The 60 or so paintings and graphic works include well-known pieces as well as the occasional **rarity** from the museum's inventory. Some **arts-and-crafts objects** give insight into the everyday life of the Biedermeier period.

The exhibition makes it particularly clear how Biedermeier painting combines the **detailed reproduction** of reality with an **idealistic imagination**. Indeed, the apparent idyll often hides the tensions of that time. Only gradually did new topics such as **life on the land**, **poverty and wealth** in the city, popular piety and natural experiences near to and far from the **environs of Vienna** become popular.

## Ballet "The Nutcracker"

In Western countries, The Nutcracker has become perhaps the most popular of all ballets, performed primarily around Christmas time. Tschaikowski's Swan Lake is part of each ballet repertoire. The version by Nurejew-Petipa-Iwanow is classic and fascinating.

The Nutcracker is a fairy tale-ballet in two acts, three scenes, by Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky, composed in 1891–92. Alexandre Dumas père's adaptation of the story "The Nutcracker and the Mouse King" by E. T. A. Hoffmann was set to music by Tchaikovsky (staged by Marius Petipa and commissioned by the director of the Imperial Theatres Ivan Vsevolozhsky in 1891).
