Vienna Spring Festival



Beethoven and Schubert are at the heart of the Spring Festival, which brings together star performers such as Hélène Grimaud, Elisabeth Leonskaja, Hilary Hahn, Viktoria Mullova and Julian Rachlin in Vienna's Konzerthaus from 2 March. A festival for fans of classical music.

Ludwig van **Beethoven** and Franz **Schubert** worked in Vienna at the transition from classical to romantic music. Their works are interpreted in a refreshingly contemporary way during the Vienna Spring Festival. **Les Musiciens du Louvre Grenoble**, under the direction of Marc Minkowski,

dedicate themselves to all of Schubert's symphonies. Schubert is also represented in the festival program with the concert performance of his **opera "Alfonso and Estrella"** and songs. The **Belcea Quartet** undertakes a high-flying musical tour with a performance of all of Beethoven's string quartets. Other classical highlights of Beethoven will be played, including the **"Eroica"**.

High-quality orchestras will be offered, such as the Vienna Philharmonic or the Rotterdam Philharmonic Orchestra, as well as first-class soloists: Viktoria Mullova, Hilary Hahn and Julian Rachlin on the violin, Hélène Grimaud, Elisabeth Leonskaja and Stefan Vladar on the piano, as well as the enchanting voices of Juliane Banse and Michelle Breedt.

A sumptuous offering of chamber music as well as **jazz and world music concerts** can also be heard as usual in Vienna's Konzerthaus. The festival is rounded out by **film performances with live music** and lectures.

Retrospective for a "New Wild One"

In spring 2012, the Kunstforum in Vienna will present the first major retrospective dedicated to the Austrian painter Herbert Brandl. The exhibition encompasses roughly 60 works produced by the artist since the early 1980s as well as new paintings.

Herbert Brandl (born 1959 in Graz, lives and works in Vienna) numbers among the **most influential artists in contemporary painting** and is considered one of the main representatives of the Austrian "New Wild Ones". His participation in documenta IX 1992, Biennale di Venezia 2007 and the personal exhibition in the Hamburg Deichtorhallen 2009 attest to his international presence. The Vienna Kunstforum is showing his works from the early 1980s and new paintings that Brandl produced specifically for the exhibition.



Ever since his early years as an artist, the subject of **landscapes** has held a dominant position in Brandl's painting. The pictorial images can be seen to shift in varying graduations between painterly and abstract on one hand and thematically objective on the other. This is expressed particularly in his works as of 2000, when the artist integrated the **mountain as concrete image** into his painting. Since then, he has produced abstract color field paintings and majestic mountain images alongside each other.

Klimt - Drawings



The enduring popularity of Gustav Klimt as a sketch artist owes much to the breathtaking sensuality of his female nudes.

"Klimt - Drawings" provides a memorable insight into Gustav Klimt's versatility, as the Albertina presents the majority of the works in its acclaimed and comprehensive collection of **170 drawings** by Klimt. This special anniversary exhibition also draws on world-class loan exhibits taken from Austrian and international collections. The definitive catalogue documenting all of Gustav Klimt's drawings was compiled at the Albertina, and continues to be updated to this day.

A broad range of **figural studies**, preparatory sketches for murals and vivid **allegorical works** is also on display. Klimt was a master of using basic media such

as chalk, lead and colored pencils, and occasionally quill pens, watercolors and gold paint, to fascinating effect. Several series of figural studies that Klimt produced as background work for his major allegorical paintings and portraits are on show at the Albertina. These drawings explore the essence of various positions, movements or moods, and each one of them has its own special intrinsic value.

Series such as these are seldom put on display, but they give a rare and far-reaching insight into the **working practice**s and creative universe of the artist, who almost never commented on his own work.

Mice in the mumok

The Museum of Modern Art – mumok presents the most important living proponent of American Pop Art, the performance and installation artist Claes Oldenburg.

With "Claes Oldenburg. The Sixties", the mumok presents the world's biggest ever exhibition of his early work from the 1960s. Oldenburg is not only the main proponent of Pop Art, but, in cooperation with Coosje van Bruggen, has also left a significant mark on art in the public space, with his monumental projects. At the center of his creative work is the industrially produced object.



The mumok shows Oldenburg's most important **Pop-Art works**: from the installation "The Street", with its graffiti-inspired presentations of modern city life, to the famous consumer item of his shop "The Store" to the spectacular consumer items of the modern "home": telephone, toilette bowl, bathtub, fan, saw, light switch. Another section is dedicated to Oldenburg's first designs of his monumental consumer objects for the public space.

The finale and highlight of the exhibition is formed by the **"Mouse Museum" situated within the mumok**, an accessible miniature museum in the form of a "Geometric Mouse", for which Oldenburg has collected a total of 381 objects since the late 1950s.

Vienna's Easter Markets

Traditional Easter crafts and artistically decorated eggs, culinary delights and a musical program all await you in March and April at Vienna's Easter markets. There is all kinds of entertainment for the little ones.



The **Easter market at Schönbrunn Palace** is considered to be among the most romantic Easter markets. With the Baroque palace in the background 58 exhibitors offer not only all kinds of culinary delights but also beautiful Easter decorations and crafts from all over Austria. Children can have fun at the marzipan Easter Bunny workshop, tying palm leaves, hunting for Easter eggs and at the children's museum, while the grownups will enjoy listening to "Jazz at the Easter Market."

The **Old Vienna Easter Market at the Freyung**, a beautiful old square in the Old City, piles up the largest mountain of Easter eggs in Europe every year totaling about 40,000 painted Easter eggs. There are countless Easter specialties to go with it, from the Easter loaf to baked Easter lambs, an Easter arts-and-crafts workshop for the little ones, puppet shows and a rabbit hutch. The **Arts and Crafts Market Am Hof** is also completely on the theme of Easter traditions and offers decorative crafts.

Long before Easter begins the **Kalvarienberg Market**, a traditional Viennese Lent market, will get you in the mood for the holidays. The market offers all kinds of entertainment, especially for children - from a carousel to a children's train, from pony rides to ship swings.
