Welcome to the ball season

Each year more than 450 balls take place in Vienna. The city of waltzes exuberantly celebrates Carnival in January and February. The three-quarter rhythm is supplemented by more contemporary sounds,

offering enjoyable dancing for every taste.

In Vienna, the ball season reaches its peak in January and February. The old tradition of carnival balls continues to thrive in the city. While some dancers enjoy following the three-quarter time of the waltzes, others may prefer letting loose to a disco beat. On New Year's Eve, Le Grand Bal starts off the ball season in grand style at the magnificent Imperial Palace. Numerous other famous ball events are held here as well: the Hunters'



Ball (Jan. 28, 2013), the Doctors' Ball (Jan. 26, 2013) and the Lawyer's Ball (Feb. 9, 2013). The Coffee-house Owners' Ball (Feb. 8, 2013) is one of the most atmospheric. Each year it brings about 5,000 visitors to Vienna's Imperial Palace and into the Redoutensäle. Many of the guests end the night at Café Landtmann, to which they are transported in a fiaker shuttle, true to style. The Opera Ball (Feb 7, 2013) at the Vienna State Opera is legendary. On this one day, visitors have the unique opportunity to see the famous opera house on Ringstrasse not only from the spectators' seats but actually experience it "backstage" surrounded by many music celebrities. The Vienna Philarmonic (Jan. 24, 2013) opens the doors to its ball at the Vienna Musikverein. However, at this event the musicians of this world-famous orchestra can only be found with their instruments during the introduction. Because even the performers of the Vienna Philarmonic want to shake a leg now and then. The sweetest ball is the Bonbon Ball (Feb. 8, 2013) a the Vienna Konzerthaus. This ball is known for its fun and informal ambiance. The Strauss Brothers once celebrated their greatest accomplishments at the Vienna Kursalon - and now visitors can dance to the tune of waltzes at the Johann Strauss Ball (Feb. 9, 2013). At the Blumenball (Flower Ball, 18 January 2013), City Hall transforms into a unique sea of flowers. A costume ball is celebrated under the motto "Salsa" at the Wiener Konzerthaus on 11 February 2013.

Vienna Ice World



From 25 January to 10 March 2013, City Hall Square (Rathausplatz) will be transformed into a gigantic ice surface, making it a paradise for ice skating fans of all ages.

The dreamily lit facade of City Hall forms the backdrop for the Vienna Ice World. The **7000 square meter surface** offers **ice-skating fans** a fabulous landscape of ice. Skaters of all styles, from spirited and wild to sweeping and elegant, can glide around the rink daily from 9 am to 10 pm to the hits of the 80s and 90s as well as waltzes.

A fantastic ice path about a kilometer long will snake through the romantically lit City Hall Park. In addition, six curling rinks await visitors. In freestanding food stands as well as stands in the heated tent and in the Alpine Hut, restaurateurs will provide guests—with finger food and culinary specialties from around the world.

Naturally, hot beverages are also available to keep you warm at the Vienna Ice World, from aromatic punch to hot tea.

1,200 pairs of **ice skates** preheated with warm air can be rented on-site. On the opening evening (19 January), ice skating is free for all.

Erwin Wurm and the Body

The Austrian artist Erwin Wurm deals with the human body in a major exhibition in the Albertina.

"De Profundis" means, translated from the Latin, "from the depths". The subtitle of Erwin Wurm's first solo exhibition in the Albertina says it all: In the show, which runs until February, Wurm develops his theme around the **human body** with a new, as yet incomplete group of works. Using a range of media, the artist, who was born in 1954, confronts the real appearance of



the body in the 21st century with the body language of the Gothic era, resulting from the spirit of internalization and asceticism.

The exhibition presents **around 100 works**, including 30 drawings and 70 sometimes large as well as reworked photographs. Wurm achieved his breakthrough a few years ago with his "One Minute Sculptures" (stages, mostly off-beat, photographically captured situations) and with the "Fat" sculptures (status symbols such as cars are shown in a bloated condition). Wurm is currently one of Austria's **most successful artists**.

Treasures of the Pyramids in Vienna

The Kunsthistorisches Museum, Vienna's Art History Museum, possesses a number of objects from the age of the pyramids, and will present these in a large exhibition from January to May 2013.

Starting in 1912, an Austrian ceremonial grave excavation team began working at the stone plateau of Giza in Egypt by opening the first graves from the period of the Old Kingdom (approx. 2650-2190 B.C.), west of the pyramid of Cheops. The excavated graves brought to light a large number of **art works and art history artifacts**, some of which found their way to the Kunsthistorisches Museum in Vienna. The statues, reliefs, coffins, and other grave items may now be seen as part of the exhibition "In the Shadow of the Pyramids. The Austrian excavations at Giza (1912-1929)".

The main piece in the exhibit and also the most significant find of the Austrian

dig is the life-size statue of Hemiunu (on loan from the Pelizaeus Museum in Hildesheim). He was the nephew of Cheops, and as one of the architects of the Cheops pyramid also had construction oversight over that large

project. These worthwhile exhibits are supplemented by digital presentations, which enable you to take a virtual trip to the Giza plateau in the Old Kingdom.

Rock the Ballet


an absolute must, from January 22 to February 3, 2013, in Hall E in the MuseumsQuartier in Vienna.

Thomas, together with his partner and wife Adrienne Canterna, has assembled a group of dancers around him, the **"Bad Boys of Dance"**. An evening with "Rock the Ballet" contains emotions and sensuality, and tells stories from real life, conveyed through the body language of the dancers.

Legally Blonde



German-language musical premiere: From 21 February, the Ronacher shows the hidden potentials of blondes with the Broadway hit "Legally Blonde".

It all began more than ten years ago with Hollywood star **Reese Witherspoon**, when she embodied blonde college student Elle Woods in the **cinema film** of the same name. The **musical version** celebrated its
Broadway premiere in 2007, then moved on to London and Sydney before coming to the **Ronacher in Vienna for its premiere in German**.

The **story is fast-paced**: In this comedy, the super-blonde in pink - quite the perfectly styled fashion doll with lapdog in hand - shows how much heart and brains she has, even though many don't suspect this to begin with. At the beginning, her friend Warner ditches her because she isn't serious enough for him, which is getting in the way of his career. Elle then follows him to Harvard to convince him otherwise. Only then does the chaos begin ...

The 30 year-old **Barbara Obermaier**, known from "Sister Act" (as Mary Roberts), "Dance of the Vampire" (Sarah) and "Rebecca", plays the lead role in Vienna.
